

# Clicker 7



Clicker 7 is a literacy and learning support software that allows educators to create customisable activities that suit the learning needs of their students.

Clicker 7 has its own eye gaze setting which works with any eye gaze system. The dwell time can be adjusted within the software. Clicker 7 also has a setting called SuperKeys which enlarges the content in Sentence Sets, Connect Sets and the Onscreen keyboard to create larger targets for eye gaze users. Clicker 7 is most suited to students that are experienced with eye gaze technology and have developed their skills in targeting and dwelling. Clicker 7 is also switch, touchscreen, mouse and keyboard accessible and therefore activities can be accessed by students who use different access methods.

Some Sentence Sets and Connect Sets allow customisation of word order including alphabetical, random, sentence order or guided order. Guided order scaffolds sentence structure by only allowing words to be selected in the correct order.

Within Clicker 7 software, educators can access the Learning Grids website where ready-made activities are shared. These activities can be played as is or edited to suit the students access method or learning goals.

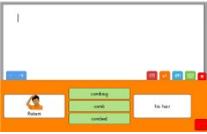
Clicker 7 is available as a single computer licence or a 5-computer license. There are also a range of school license options available. The software is installed on the computer and does not require internet access for the student to use it. However, internet access is required to download ready-made activities from the Learning Grids website which can be saved and used later. Clicker 7 is available as a 28-day trial that can be downloaded from the Cricksoft website.

This resource references the Unlocking Abilities key levels which provide a framework for evaluating a student's eye gaze skills. 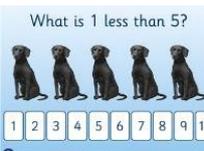

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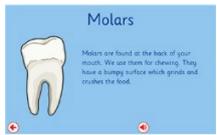

<p><b>1 Less Than or 1 More Than Custom Sets</b></p> 	<p>This activity presents a number line and allows the student to identify the number that is either 1 less than or 1 more than. 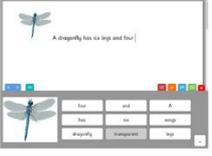


<p><b>Shapes and Sides Sentence Sets</b></p> 	<p>Allows the student to construct sentences about the number of sides on common 2-D shapes.</p>	<p>Key 4B: Finding the right one</p>	<p>ACMMG009</p>
<p><b>Counting Connect Sets</b></p> 	<p>Allows the student to construct sentences about how many objects are shown in a series of pictures.
